The History of the Foederatio Internationalis Una Voce 1964-2003

Here is a unique contribution to modern Catholic literature.

Leo Darroch presents in chronological order a factual history, fully referenced, of the work of the Foederatio Internationalis Una Voce, a movement of lay people formed after the sudden and insensitive enforcement of Novus Ordo Missae. It is the first fully documented account of the decades-long struggle for the preservation of the traditional rite of the Mass in the face of unrelenting opposition from the bishops of the Church.

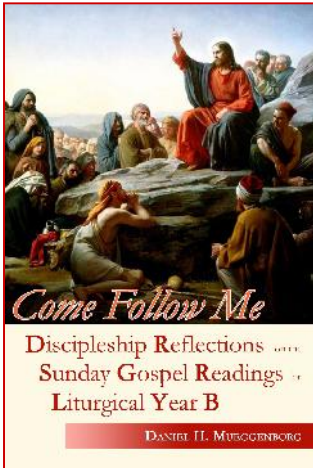
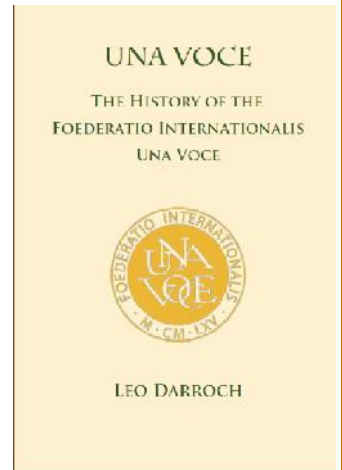

Daniel H Mueggenborg

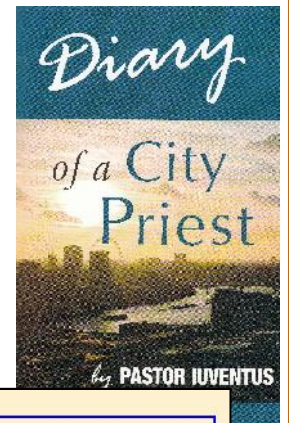

Fr Dominic Allain

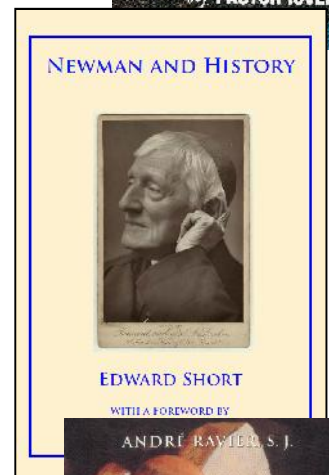

Saint Bruno the Carthusian

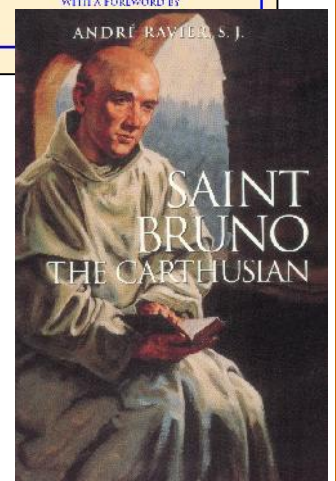
André Ravier SJ

St Bruno was born in Cologne around 1030. He studied at the university of Rheims, where he later taught and was rector for nearly 20 years. Chosen as the new Archbishop, he had other plans - he had decided to follow Christ in the desert and with six companions settled in a mountainous and uninhabited area of the Alps, Chartreuse. They built an oratory and individual cells, they lived in poverty entirely occupied in prayer and study. André Ravier's classic biography reveals the real Bruno.

The Secret Cemetery

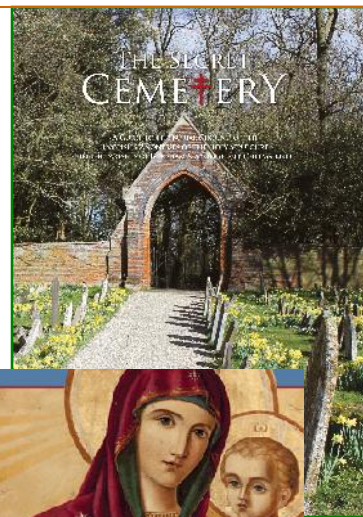

Cemeteries are so much more than a place for burials, and the burial ground of the English canonesses of the Holy Sepulchre in Chelmsford is certainly no exception. Created in 1799, it is thought to be the oldest Catholic cemetery in continuous use in England. The physical location of the cemetery, tucked away in the distant corner, echoes the need for secrecy which was necessary in this period. In the 1790's, Catholicism was still illegal and Catholics could not vote or sit in Parliament. Specifically Catholic burial grounds were only legally allowed after 1847. Richly illustrated, this book reveals the hitherto unknown history of this unique cemetery.

Every Day with Mary

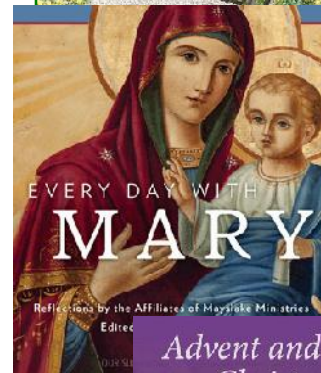

Advent and Christmas with Mary

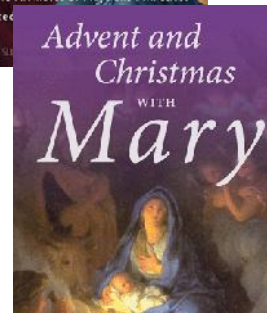

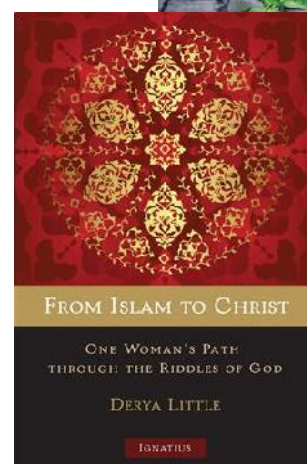
One Woman's Path Through the Riddles of God
